Race check-in time is 8:30 a.m. and races start at 9:00 a.m. Depending on run-off at this time of year, the White River may be a Class II with high water, turbulent obstacles and potential strainers. Prizes will be awarded at a ceremony to be held in town following the race at approximately 4:00 p.m. A full calendar of activities will be included in the participant packet sent following receipt of the registration.
